

# **A FEAST OF FELLOWSHIP**

Dear Friends, Our Mission Statement is "We gather at God's table. We share a journey of discovery. We rejoice in serving others through the grace of God in Christ." The first, "Gather," refers to bonds of unity and fellowship. Psalm 133 says it with feeling: "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brothers to

*dwell together in unity!"* The next verse adds: *"It is like the precious oil upon the head, coming down upon the beard, even Aaron's beard, coming down upon the edge of his robes."* St. George's has experienced both lately: We have had some times of notable dining ("*oil upon the beard,"* if you will) at the Seder dinner, the April Family Night, and the Parish Picnic, each attended by over 100 people. Last week Bishop Johnson was here to celebrate recent "Feasts of Fellowship," where the oil was the Oil of Chrismation, and was on the forehead, not the beard.

At Bishop Johnson's Visitation, twenty eight persons were Confirmed, Received, or Reaffirmed their Baptismal Vows.

- On May 21, St. George's will present another group of 15 at Grace-St. Luke's, midtown.
- Since January 1, we have received Letters of Transfer for another 25 People.
- Our average Sunday Attendance is about 250, up 27% over last year.

In these ways we celebrate relationships with Christ and His Church. Increasing numbers are a sign that God in his Word, Jesus, is touching people's lives: "And the word of God was increasing in power; and the number of the disciples ...became very great..." (Acts 6:7). We are members of the Body of Christ in order to extend the power of his Presence, but not as when we become members of a growing club, but as we become the hands, feet and voice of Christ. There is great blessing in being an agent of God, whether in a large church or a small one.

An Orthodox theologian made a telling observation which may unfortunately characterize some Christians' self-understanding. *"We sometimes see the West act-ing as if the Church were an institution dispensing sacraments. For us in the East the Church is a Sacrament embodied in institutions."* Even if our numbers grow, Sacrament, Mystery, Relationship and Mission come before Institution. But on the other hand, our relationship with God, primarily a Sacramental reality, is embodied in institutional, incarnational, ministry: *"Inasmuch as you have not done it to*"

one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you have not done it to me." (Matt. 25:44).

We have an unofficial motto at St. George's: "No spectators." St. George's is mission oriented -- we have just created a position of Administrator of Mission and Ministry -- otherwise we would become an Institution first and only. When we make offerings we do so not to meet the needs of an institution, but to fulfill our vocation to serve. We worship not with words primarily, but with gifts, like the Magi: gifts of time, talent and treasure, gifts of service, which represent our selves. We are not essentially consumers of religion; we don't belong to a church primarily "to get something out of it" (although we do receive God's blessing). We gather as givers, as stewards, to learn the mysterious ways of the Giver of all Good, to extend his touch and the power of his word. We feast on fellowship. We Gather, Discover, and Serve.



# Chandelier Dedicated to The Glory of God

# Symbolic of The Light of Christ, Chandelier Marks Complete Narthex



Saturday evening, April 19, the narthex chandelier at St. George's Episcopal Church was dedicated to the glory of God. The huge, custom-crafted lighting fixture was designed and built by Viggo Rambusch at the Rambusch Studios in New York. The parent company, Rambusch Decorating Company was founded in 1898 by Danish-born Frode Rambusch, and has been internationally renowned for over a century for their lighting, ecclesiastical arts, art glass and metal work for churches and public buildings. Viggo Rambusch, nephew of the founder, was also the project manager for the FDNY Memorial Wall erected in 2006 to commemorate the firemen and others who lost their lives during the tragedy of 9/11.

Viggo Rambusch, a professional Member of the American Society of Interior Design and a Fellow of the Illuminating Engineering Society, was the lighting consultant for the illumination system for the new St. George's church. His design for the narthex chandelier is of red oak and metal to match the soaring trusses and other woodwork featured throughout the church. The chandelier is designed with arches which mimic the arches throughout the nave. The fixture's up lighting casts shadows on the massive trusses which can be seen from Germantown Road as well as from

within. The down lighting creates light and shadows in the narthex to enhance the beauty of that space in which worshipers gather. The height at which the chandelier is hung creates the effect of a ceiling in the vast height of the narthex. The design and placement of this unique fixture completes the overall design of this awe-inspiring worship space by James Williamson, FAIA, architect.

The chandelier is a gift to St. George's Episcopal Church from Stuart and Angela Wilkinson and was given in honor of their grandchildren: Emma, Andrew and Charlie Datch. The children traveled from Washington, DC with their parents, Rachael and Demetri Datch, to be present with their proud grandparents, family and friends from St. George's for this very special occasion. Stuart Wilkinson served as Chairman of the Building Completion Fund and it is through the hard work of Stuart and his committee that funds were raised for the beautiful gifts and liturgical furnish-

ings which adorn the church. A clarinet and organ concert, featuring Carina Washington and Dr. Angela Saunders and hosted by St. George's Friends of Music followed the dedication on this evening of celebration.

# The Art of the Icon Exhibit Comes to St. George's Creator of St. George's Own Icon Shares Other Works of Art (June 1-July 30)

American artist, Mary Jane Miller, who makes her home in San Miguel de Allende, GTO, Mexico and Sante Fe, New Mexico, will have an exhibit of her work at the St. George's Art Gallery inside of St. George's Episcopal Church. The exhibit will open June 1 and continue until July 30.

Ms. Miller was commissioned to create the Icon of St. George, which hangs prominently in the nave at St. George's, as a memorial for former parishioner Betty McCall. The icon was created using traditional materials and artistry in egg tempera and repousse. Ms. Miller is an experienced iconographer who has worked for ten years in egg tempera and 23k gold leaf, a technique which dates back to the Egyptian mummy portraiture. With her partner and fellow artist, they have added repousse to their icon work which adds hammered and engraved silver or pewter to the border of icons.

Ms. Miller sought out the expertise of her life-long partner, Gomez, to elaborate on what had become a fascination with all techniques involved in iconography throughout history. She says she is challenged and fascinated with the icons' intrinsic and mystical elements. "Combining the physical



painting and a life of prayer enables us to explore and enter into our relationship with God and His creation. The discipline of icongraphy allows one to make contact with something deeper than what you're painting. The faces reflect the somber, the challenged and the martyred. I find myself wondering, 'What, besides spiritual awe, are icons trying to tell us about the highest and best experiences of our human condition?' The answers lead us back to our faith and hope as spiritual people."

The hauntingly beautiful icons, created by Mary Jane Miller in styles of portrait, graven images, repousse and narrative can be viewed on her website at www.sanmiguelicons.com. Ms. Miller, a friend of St. George's rector, Father Gary Sturni and his wife, Cindy, will be visiting Germantown during the exhibit. A reception with the visiting artist is planned, with dates to be announced. Please call the church office at 754-7282 for additional information and plan to join us to view this exquisite exhibit hosted by the St. George's Art Gallery Committee.
